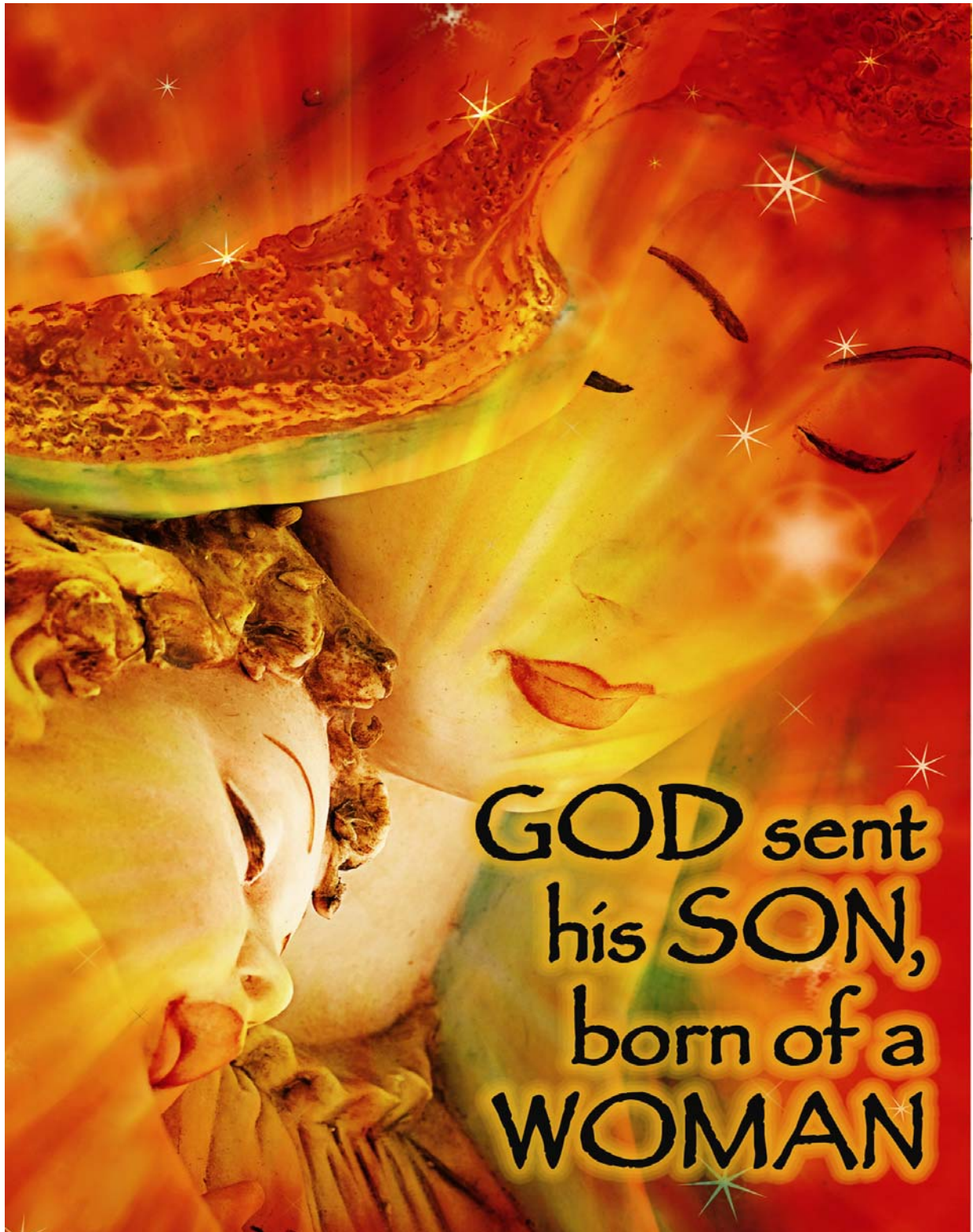

Mary is the ideal disciple, the model listener. She hears God's word and acts on it. In Luke's first two chapters Mary is evangelized by Gabriel, by Elizabeth, by the shepherds, by Simon, by Anna, and by Jesus himself. All of them proclaim the good news of God's presence and sing in praise of God's goodness. Luke tells us that Mary kept all these things in her heart, turning them over and over again. Mary is indeed the "Listening Disciple" and this is the core of New Testament spirituality: all disciples, like Mary, are called to listen to the word of God attentively and act on it. Let us ask from Mary the grace to be a listener, "to listen to the word of God and act on it." (Missionary Spirituality of St. Vincent de Paul)

We begin the new year by responding to Jesus' call that we feed the hungry and help the homeless. On Friday, January 27, our members will gather in the Club Room from 3pm to 5pm to prepare Survival Packs for the homeless men and women in the shelters provided by religious organizations. We need donations of loaves of sliced bread and homemade or store bought cookies to include in the packs. If you wish to make a monetary donation for meat, cheese, and juice, please place your donation in a sealed envelope addressed to SVDP, and drop it in the Sunday collection basket or at the rectory. If you write a check, make it payable to Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Each packet costs \$10 to produce. ## BENEFITS OF REGISTERING AT SAINT PASCAL

Keeping up with a parish of 2000 families can be a challenge! Saint Pascal also serves many more families who are not registered but who still come to us for pastoral care. It is beneficial for both the parish administration and the individual families to be registered. Registration is a confirmation of our desire and commitment to give ourselves to God and to one another in our community of faith. Our weekly offering is a prayer expressed through our material gifts received through our labors.

There are many concerns and difficulties that may make some reluctant to make this commitment. Some of the benefits of being registered include:

1. You will receive important mailings at Christmas, Easter and other times throughout the year, keeping you up to date on parish news.
2. Registration is proof of membership in the Church.
3. Preference of choice of dates for your Church celebrations.
4. Regular mailings of envelopes for Sunday offerings with name, address, and a number assigned to each registered parishioner printed on each envelope. Your offerings are confidentially recorded by our staff for proof of donations and tax purposes. Without using envelopes, we cannot verify your donations.
5. Persons involved in lay ministry should be registered in the parish.

Parishes often request verification of a person's status as a practicing Catholic, attendance at Mass, etc., when a person has been asked to be a Godparent or sponsor. Without registration, no such verification can be given.

If you would like to register, please stop by at the parish office and our staff will be happy to assist you.

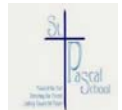

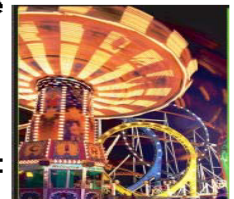
