My name is Beau Surratt and I am excited to be the new Director of Music and Liturgy here at St. Pascal.

Prior to coming to St. Pascal I served as Associate for Music and Administration (the equivalent of combining Rosemary Renault's job at St. Pascal with mine) at All Saints' Episcopal Church in the Ravenswood neighborhood of Chicago.

I grew up as a Southern Baptist in West Tennessee and gradually worked my way up what I call the "liturgical food chain" to the Roman Catholic Church by way of the Episcopal Church. When I was finally confirmed in the Catholic Church, several people who had known me since I was very young said that they knew I'd been working up to this since I was 9 years old. I most certainly bring to my work at St. Pascal the zeal of a convert. I have a deep love for God, the Church and the Liturgy in particular, and I hope that shines forth in the relationships I will build with all of you.

I've been working as a church musician since I was 14 years-old, and I've been doing this work for 14 years (that tells you how old I am!) in both Catholic and Protestant Churches. I began my college career as a music major, but my degree ended up being in Theology and Religion because I began to have a sense that God was calling me to love and serve the Church as a whole – to be more than just a musician— and to build up God's Kingdom particularly through music and liturgy work. As a fairly new (at least officially) Catholic, I look forward to discerning what additional opportunities for ministry God might be calling me to and I also hope to pursue additional graduate-level education (at a part-time level, of course) in Theology and Liturgy at some point in the near future.

When I'm not at Church, I enjoy getting caught up on the latest in pop culture from friends (who are almost always at least 20 years older than me—I'm what they call an "old soul"), using technology (I'm really into Apple products—iPhones, iPads, iAnything), trying new restaurants, biking and reading.

I look forward to getting to know as many people as possible in what I can already tell is a vibrant and welcoming parish! LOVE MEANS HAVING TO SAY YOU'RE SORRY

We in the Archdiocese of Chicago lived through a couple very uncomfortable weeks as Cardinal George was being challenged for rather volatile comments he made comparing the Gay Pride Parade to the Ku Klux Klan. Regardless of how you feel about the gay rights movement, the comments were shocking. The organizers of the parade, I thought, showed considerable restraint in their reaction to the Cardinal. (I do not count bloggers in this. Bloggers usually are people who don't have enough to do with their lives and too much to say about it.)

I felt constrained in voicing my opinion about the controversy because I don't think it is my role to correct the Cardinal. But Cardinal George sees one of his most important roles as that of teacher. After about two weeks of back and forth, the Cardinal issued a very well-worded apology for his remarks. In this apology, he showed himself to be a teacher at his best. He showed all of us how to apologize: 1) he recognized what he had said was wrong; 2) he recognized that his words had caused pain; 3) he didn't make excuses or rationalizations. One thing he did say that was very important was his personal concern about the attacks on religious liberty in America. That fear, he said, was the backdrop of his mindset which fueled the unfortunate comments. His apology showed that legitimate concerns can morph into irrational fears. I think it takes a big man to admit to that within himself.

Our Christian faith teaches that God often uses moments of sin for grace to surface. Perhaps this could even turn into a more civil and fruitful dialogue between the Church, the gay community and other groups with whom there are differences. Just the possibility that we could become better neighbors to each other is a sign of hope.

As odd as it may sound, I believe this turned into one of Cardinal George's shining moments as our archbishop. He has the courage to show humility. He gave us an example and that is the best means of teaching. In his pursuit of sanctity, he showed us yet another element of that pursuit for all of us to embrace.

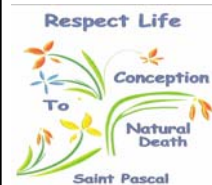
