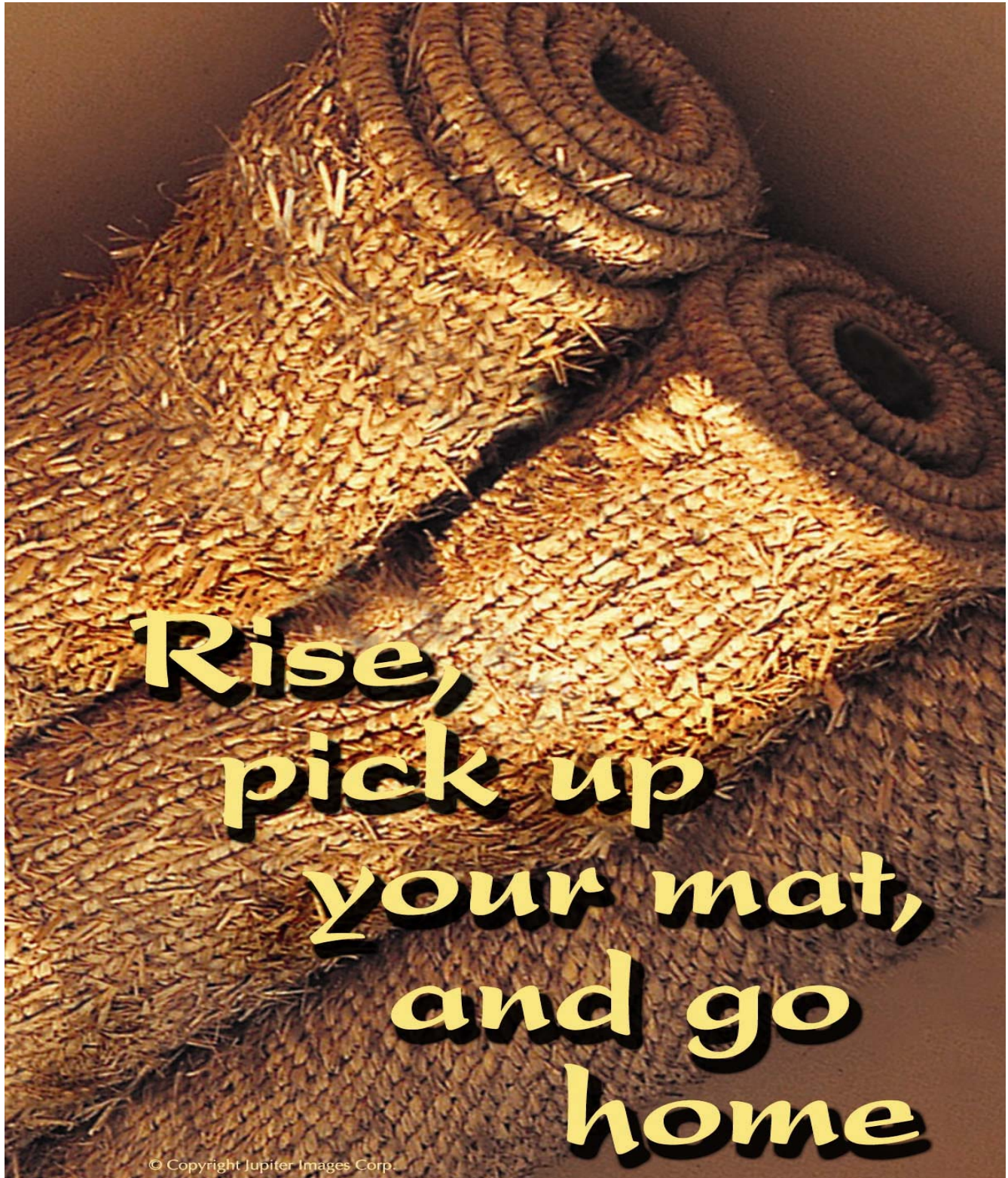

WELCOME BISHOP MANZ

I am out of town until Monday and Bishop Manz was kind enough to volunteer to offer Mass at Saint Pascal in my absence. We are blessed to have the Episcopal Vicar for Vicariate IV with us. What is an Episcopal Vicar??? And what is a Vicariate IV??? That's just "Church talk" for the auxiliary bishop in our Archdiocese who assists the Cardinal and oversees our particular area or vicariate. It's a little like Chicago is divided into wards, so the Archdiocese is divided into vicariates. I have the pleasure of working with Bishop Manz as dean. OK, now you want to know what a dean is. A deanery might be compared to a precinct. In my capacity as dean I assist the bishop essentially as a liaison to fourteen parishes, two high schools and one shrine in our immediate area. Vicariate IV has five deaneries each with a dean. And now you know more than you ever wanted to know about all that. Thank you, Bishop Manz for being with your people at Saint Pascal!

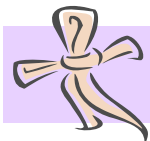

Family is the nucleus of all Communities. Regrettably, there are families whose structure is fractured because some members haven't spoken to each other for years. Alienation has become such a part of family history that it is almost impossible to overcome. When family members have taken sides, this creates tension at family celebrations and reunions. No one, including parents or guardians, can force anyone to forgive whatever actions or words created the dispute. A self-righteous **anger** keeps alienated member(s) **from forgiving** or from **accepting forgiveness**. So, they may miss family celebrations of life and joy, and find themselves seriously hurting mentally and spiritually at family wakes and funerals. When we pray the Our Father, we pray that God forgives us as we forgive others. This prayer reminds us that forgiving is a divine act of mercy. When we forgive others we are acting in and by God's power. All we can do is to pray that one of the **alienated members** will take the first step **by asking forgiveness...or by forgiving...** for whatever it is that created the rift, instead of waiting for the **other(s)** to take the first step.



LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all Fridays of Lent.
Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The Small Christian Communities of St. Pascal continue to meet and share in the action of God in their lives through The Profession of Faith. We are doing this by using the Catechism of the Catholic Church for direction.

Week Two Focus: The Paschal Mystery: Jesus' Death and Resurrection

The Paschal mystery ... stands at the center of the Good News that the apostles, and the Church following them, are to proclaim to the world (571). The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by His death, Christ liberates us from sin; by His Resurrection, He opens for us the way to a new life (Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraphs 654). Jesus fulfilled the Law perfectly, but He often offended the teachers of the Law, for he was not content to propose His interpretation alongside theirs but taught the people "as one who had authority, and not as their scribes" (Matthew 7:28-29) (CCC 581). Jesus did not destroy the Law: he fulfilled it (CCC 577). He upset the Pharisees when he showed His merciful conduct toward sinners. He was seen as blaspheming when he made himself God's equal or was speaking the truth.

It was, in fact, His role in the redemption of sins ... [that] was the true stumbling-block (cf. Luke 2:34; 20:17-18; Psalm 118:22) for the religious authorities (CCC 578-589). Many of the leaders of the Temple at that time were so afraid that all they could think to do was to get rid of this person who called them to be something more than they were. Jesus has issued that same call to all of us. *Becoming more familiar with what we believe as Catholics can help us to better relate to the action of God's work in our daily lives. Trust that one day, when you're embracing all that life has to offer—challenge, laughter, growth, wisdom, intimacy, love—you'll do so with an added dimension of the profound joy that can come only after you've known profound sorrow.

Realize that your grieving is, in fact, an encounter with the Eternal, your broken heart an entrance way for God. Your turmoil and confusion, your pain and despair, can be openings to life's most profound mysteries: the depth of love that people share, the meaning that life holds for you, the promise of rebirth, and the constancy of God's love.

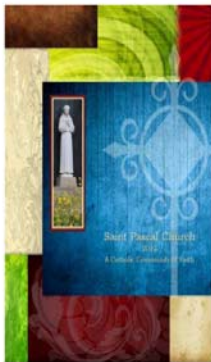
